Service Learning

 Science students collect and analyze water samples, document their results, and present their finding to a local pollution agency.

PARD model provides a planning framework for student learning and service activities.

- Action
- Reflection
- Demonstration (and Celebration)


- Two Champs are currently working with SRES Eagles' Clubs

Summer 2019 Literacy Champions


- 8 high school students were hired
