SRES Principal Letter: Addressing Grief

It has been over a month since our school and Community suffered the devastating loss of first grade student, Bella Leon. Our deepest condolences to her family and those close to her. Losing someone so young and so suddenly is difficult for many to process.

The National Association of School Psychologists provides these suggestions for elementary-age students experiencing grief (learn more at <u>bit.ly/2YDe4V4</u>):

- These students may ask questions and seek to try to understand what happened. Be patient and refer them to adults that can answer their questions.
- Students below the age of eight may engage in magical thinking and believe they could have prevented the death.
- Recognize these feelings and fears but do not validate them.
- Students ages nine through twelve may feel less comfortable showing feelings and seeing expressions of grief in others.
- Decreased concentration Poor school performance Depression Irritability Withdrawal Somatic complaints (headaches & stomachaches)

• Make sure to provide these students with a variety of ways to express grief.


