Mesa Community College offers a great certificate program for a Veterinary Assistant that would be covered under the Higher Education scholarship at 100%.

This certificate program can be completed in as little as two semesters if attending full-time. The average wage for a Veterinary Assistant for the Mesa area is \$26K - \$39K. For a higher salary in the field, you may also want to get an associate degree at MCC in Veterinary Technology, which is also covered at 100% by our scholarship.

# Maricopa Community College: How to Access My Itemized Tuition With Schedule

If you are wondering how to access your itemized tuition with schedule, just follow these steps and they will help you. If you have any questions, call your advisor or the Higher Education office.

- Go to your school's website. Ex: www.Scottsdalecc.edu
- 2. Click on the "Students" tab at the top of the page.
- 3. Under "Student Tools" click on the "Student Center" tab.
- 4. Sign in with your username and password.
  Username example: wes123456@maricopa.edu
- 5. You may have Duo Push for verification or another way of verification.
- 6. Verify if the computer is yours or not.
- 7. Click on the "Financial Account" tab.
- 8. On the left of the page you will click on "Account Statement"
- 9. You will click on the Institution (School) you are going to with the correct term (Spring 2024)
- Your student account statement will appear and you will click on the blue "Print Statement" button.
- 11. Click on the "Print" link at the top of the page. It may look like a printer icon.
- 12. Under "Destination" select "Save to PDF" or "Print to PDF"
- 13. Click on "Save" or "Print"
- 14. Save the document
- 15. Email your advisor with the document that you just saved as an attachment.
